In addition to being a registered architect, Bruce is certified by the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) and is a LEED accredited professional. He is a member of the United States Green Building Council, American Institute of Architecture, Urban Land Institute, Congress for New Urbanism, National Trust for Historic Preservation and Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation.

Bruce graduated from Amherst College and received MBA and Master of Architecture degrees from Yale. Prior to joining Becker + Becker as its President in 1988, Bruce interned in the architectural offices of Edward Larrabee Barnes and managed mixed-use development for the Prudential Property Company in Northern California. He has lectured and served on architectural juries at Yale University, Amherst College, Connecticut College, Harvard Business School, University of Maryland and the Institute for Architecture and Urban Studies. Bruce has also presented at industry conferences on green design, historic preservation and affordable housing throughout the United States.

Bruce co-founded two non-profit housing organizations formed to create innovative affordable housing projects: *Common Ground Community*, developer of the Times Square Hotel Supportive Housing; and *Under One Roof*, developer of The Marvin Intergeneration Child Care and Congregate Housing in Norwalk, Connecticut. He was formerly chairman of the board of the Harlem School of the Arts and has served on the AIA's National Affordable Housing Task Force. He currently serves on the board of the Institute for Architecture and Urban Studies.
